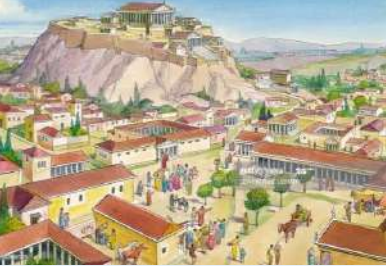

<p>akropoli <i>acropolis</i></p>	<p>Il-parti għolja ta' belt Griega tal-Qedem li tkun iffortifikata. L-aktar waħda magħrufa hi l-Akropoli ta' Ateni.</p>	<p>The fortified part of an Ancient Greek city usually situated on a hill. The most famous one is the Acropolis of Athens.</p>

Bizantini <i>Byzantines</i>	Iċ-ċittadini tal-Imperu Ruman tal-Lvant bejn is-sena 330 W.K. u 1453 W.K. Dan kien magħruf ukoll bħala l-Imperu Bizantin.	The citizens of the Eastern Roman Empire between 330 AD and 1453 AD. Also known as Byzantine Empire.	
Bosforu <i>Bosphorus</i>	L-istrett fit-Turkija li jifred il-kontinenti tal-Ewropa u l-Asja.	The strait (narrow waterway) in Turkey that separates the continents of Europe and Asia.	
bronż <i>bronze</i>	Metall b'saħħtu magħmul minn taħlita ta' ramm u landa.	A strong metal alloy made by mixing copper and tin.	
ċenturjun (pl. ċenturjuni) <i>centurion</i>	Uffiċjal fl-armata Ruman li kien jikkmanda mitt legjonarju. Bil-Latin <i>centuria</i> tfisser 'mija'. Iċ-ċenturjuni kienu jintgħażlu għall-qlubija tagħhom fil-ġlied.	An official in the Roman army in charge of a hundred legionaries. In Latin <i>centuria</i> means 'one hundred'. They were chosen on account of their bravery in battle.

sarkofagu (pl. sarkofagi) <i>sarcophagus</i>	Kontenitur li fih kien jitqiegħed it-tebut bil-ġisem tal-mejjet.	A container in which the coffin containing the body of the deceased is placed.	
Senat Ruman <i>Roman Senate</i>	L-Assemblea ta' Ruma magħmula bejn 300 u 500 senator maħtura l-aktar mill-klassi tal-patrizji. Fis-Senat, l-Imperatur kien imexxi d-diskuzzjoni u jressaq liġijiet ġodda.	The advisory council consisting of 300 - 500 senators serving for life mostly from the patrician class. In the Senate, the Emperor presided over discussions and proposed new laws.
